

2700 North School Zone Corridor



BRIEF DESCRIPTION: This walking/bike corridor runs from the intersection of 2700 N & state Rd. 126 (2000 W.) west along 2700 N. to the border of Plain City. This also implements a corridor identified in the WFRC Regional Transportation Plan.

RECOMMENDED CORRIDOR TYPE:
Category 2: Buffered Bike Lane

RECOMMENDED CORRIDOR USES:
Cars, Marked bike lanes, with sidewalks for pedestrians.

CORRIDOR CONNECTIONS: State Road 126 north and south connections. Corridor connections to future Willard canal trail, Myita subdivision trail Farr West Meadows trail and west to Plain City.

AREAS OF CONCERN: High traffic use, with high traffic speeds. (45 mph) This is a major traffic corridor for the west end of Farr West and Plain City. There are 2 schools and 1 church which adds extra vehicle traffic at certain parts of the day. There is a dangerous S curve at the west end of this corridor where the road narrows with no shoulder, for cyclists or sidewalk for pedestrians.

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY: Easy

APPROXIMATE CORRIDOR LENGTH: 1 mile

RESPONSIBLE ENTITIES: Farr West City, Plain City, UDOT.

EXISTING CONDITIONS: Asphalt paved road with mostly curb, gutter and partial sidewalk.
